1932: there was a wooden pile-dwelling called "Il Valentino" on the Passetto's seaside between the caves no. 24 and 26.

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On the pile-dwelling there were two rows of bathing-huts and a platform where people could eat and dance.

The Cerusici brothers, Rodolfo and Vittorio, were both authors and managers of the open-air dance-hall, that got a huge success.

The story goes that someone envious, maybe fond of "Palombina" and "La Salute" seasides, the only bathing-equipped beaches, in the night-time threw some stones from the cliff above, that hurt a women, therefore II Valentino was forced to shut down. Then times changed and the war put an end to the tradition of II Valentino.

Today in memory of my ancestors I, Cerusico Claudio, will revive "Il Valentino dance-hall" May 2009
